MIDDLE HOUR SUNDAY NOVEMBER 11

Special Guest: Father John Schultz

Coming up in the Middle Hour for November 11 will be Father John Schultz's report of his immigration immersion trip to El Paso, Texas and Ciudad Juarez, Mexico. Father John serves as chaplain at HSHS St. Joseph's and Sacred Heart Hospitals, and was the co-chair, with Curt Rohland, of the Lutheran-Catholic twelve-member committee that planned the Common Prayer Service in observance of the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation last October. Father John was one of a group of fourteen men who spent a week on the US-Mexican border seeing and hearing how immigration impacts the lives of people on both sides of that border between El Paso and Ciudad. He will share this experience with us during the middle hour, November 11, providing a moral and ethical perspective on what immigrants are facing along the border and how they are being treated on both sides of that border.


This comforting OSLC ministry needs your help! There are several ways to assist.
